Dear Co-chairmen Carlson and Portell:

I have your letter wherein you ask whether clerks of the circuit court may participate in the General Assembly Retirement System. I deem your inquiry to be of such a nature to warrant this response. Participation in the System is open to Jan Carlson Willard V. Portell - 2.

"any member". (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1973, ch. 108 1/2, par. 2-107.)
Public Act 79-959 amended the definition of "member" to
include persons other than General Assembly members. Section
2-105 of the Illinois Pension Code (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1973, ch.
108 1/2, par. 2-105, as amended by P.A. 79-959) now reads as
follows:

"'Member': Members of the General Assembly of this State including persons who enter military service while a member of the General Assembly provided that the President of the Senate in office on August 15, 1969, and a member of the system, shall be eligible as a member only until the expiration of his term of office; and

Any person elected by vote of the people of the whole State to the Office of Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Treasurer, Comptroller, or Attorney General for the period of his service in such office."

Public Act 79-959 enables the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State, Treasurer, Comptroller and Attorney General to participate in the General Assembly Retirement System. It is a fundamental principle of statutory construction that the enumeration of certain things in a statute

implies the exclusion of others. (In re Estate of Leichtenberg, 7 Ill. 2d 545.) The definition of "member" in Public Act 79-959 enumerates certain elected officials but makes no mention of clerks of the circuit court; it must be assumed, therefore, that the legislature did not intend to include clerks of the circuit court within the definition of "member". Since clerks of the circuit court court are not members, it is my opinion that they may not participate in the General Assembly Ratirement System.
